
Make a family-favorite finger food and type copies of the recipe to share. Add your food item to the Punchbowl reminder soon to come.




Martha Tillman and Lisa Hall monitored voting during recent mid-term elections. We honor your Community Service.

Tech Tidbits

Photo Editing Tip

Do you have family photos that are in low resolution or damaged? There is an easy and free web site that will improve the faces of your photos using artificial intelligence (AI). The technology fills in a photo's missing or fuzzy info with realistic detail in a few seconds. Based on my searching, this site is from a reputable company that wants to demonstrate its new technology. This site will only correct faces and leave the rest of the photo untouched. This works out fine since the face is often the most important part of the photo.

To try it out copy this long website address into your browser (computer, tablet or phone):

This is a simple one-page website named a technical name of "baseten with GFP-GAN". Simply click on the "Choose file" tab and search your device for the photo in need of restoration. Then click on the photo to enter it into website. Then on the website, click on the "Restore photo" tab. You will see a spinning wheel indicating it is processing the photo. The original photo will appear on the left and then in about 15 seconds the edited photo will appear on the right. Compare the before and after photos to verify that you like the improvement. The old photo blotches, cracks and imperfections should be gone. Click on the caption "Download the restored image" under the edited photo. This will enlarge the photo for a better view and allow you to download it to your device.

I've found this process improves almost all photos, sometimes amazingly well. However, sometimes the faces may still look fuzzy (because of poor condition of original) or a little distorted/ not looking like the original person (because of the Al model). Have some fun with it and try it out.

Pre-Convention Activities Shared

Three activities will be offered as pre-convention fun to the 2023 NC DKG Convention in Greenville, April 28-30, 2023—a workshop, a tour of ECU, and a self-guided tour of the host city.

Dr. Kaye Dotson will present the workshop "Putting Traditional Play Back into Practice for Children: Engage, Learn, Play." The workshop will begin at 10 a.m. on Friday, April 27, followed by a field trip to ECU/Pitt County Community School for hands-on activities with the children. Cost is \$50, with \$25 being donated to the NC DKG Educational Foundation. Participants will receive a copy of Dr. Dotson's book and may earn one CEU.

An afternoon bus tour of East Carolina University will give attendees a view of West and Main Campuses and include a visit to the ECU/Pitt County Community School to visit there and meet with the principal about the research and technology used in the school. Cost is \$10.

Self-guided tour of "Uptown Greenville" using a provided map will allow you to visit various museums, shops, and restaurants on Friday and during your stay. Convention Chair Dr. Phyllis Broughton and the Convention Planning Committee will be happy to answer questions about the three pre-convention options.
