An Update on One of Our Own: Teacher by Day, Counselor by Night

After completing the Clinical Mental Health Counseling MS program at Capella, Melinda Willison has been short-term contracted by Carolina Family & Maternal Counseling in Matthews to provide group and skills support services for psychoeducation related to mental wellness. While working through the steps to state licensure, Melinda is providing a series of 11+ programs in the evenings and Saturdays virtual and in-person for ages 4-6, boys 9-12, girls 9-18, and adults of all ages. Once licensed, Melinda will begin to provide individual, family, and couples counseling in addition to the groups.

Having stepped down from the classroom to complete 600+ hours of fieldwork, Melinda has also returned to the still-open position in 5th grade at Lansdowne amidst pandemic-level teacher shortages. #together

In November, Melinda was awarded a \$1000 scholarship from the National Society of Leadership and Success at the 2021 Fall Virtual Leadership Summit for her active participation and insights on leadership in the present workforce held November 5 & 6 for graduate students.

Chapter Communications with Elected Officials

From Jennifer De La Jara, CMS School Board Member-At-Large January 30, 2022

At the Board of County Commissioners' budget retreat meeting, a commissioner asked County Manager, Dena Diorio, to look into what it would take to match Wake County's teacher supplement, noting that Mecklenburg County was in second place. While that sounds like a good idea on the surface, many of us in education already know that Wake's average supplement is only \$100 more than Mecklenburg. For a 10-month salaried teacher, that equates to \$10/Month **before** taxes. Write your Commissioners today to let them know that our teachers deserve more! Ask them to engage in a meaningful conversation with CMS about what it would take to increase the supplement and meet the needs of our educators.

Our students are losing teachers at alarming rates, but the law gives local government a seat at the table. We have the tools to recruit and retain the best and brightest, but the Commission also has the resources.


In a Nutshell Jan 2022

The Foundation's second annual Day of Giving


was held November 20, 2021. A total of \$6957.05 was raised through generous donations from members and from friends of the Foundation.


Tech Tidbits: Navigating <a>rac

Zoom can be confusing for lots of reasons: version updates, different formats for different devices, and clicking certain buttons in certain views can add more complications. It's been a while since we've featured a how-to. The foremost tip is to view from a laptop or desktop, especially if you are a zoom or tech novice. Secondly, log in 10-15 minutes early in case you need support—you can receive it without interrupting the meeting. Additionally, focus and engage in the session, rather than multitasking.
