UNCC Education Dean Zooms with Kappa

Dr. Teresa Petty, Interim Dean of the Cato College of Education at UNC Charlotte, spoke to Kappa members via Zoom on Saturday, April 17. Her research interests include online teaching/learning and National Board Certification. She is developing a new Graduate program that focuses on National Board Certification.

Shortly after becoming Interim Dean, the Pandemic hit. Despite this, she led the College of Education through the accreditation process successfully with no improvements cited.

There is a shortage of teachers in NC but UNCC is second only to East Carolina in enrollment of teachers. UNCC is one of five colleges in NC that offers Teaching Fellows in math, science, and special education. They have also opened a lab school during this difficult time. Kappa has been invited to tour the Cato College of Education and the lab school.

As Kappa celebrates its 80th Anniversary, the Cato College of Education at UNCC celebrates its 50th Anniversary and UNCC turns 75.

Legislative Updates

Deborah Dryden - Law and Policy Committee

The NC House is considering several bills that effect the education of students in the state.



House Bill 790 – Inform Public of Instructional Materials, Total Transparency

This bill will require lesson plans by subject and grade level to be posted on the school website
prior to the start of each quarter or semester.
 Most lesson plans are completed on the computer so uploading would not be difficult.

House Bill 711 – Integrate Black History and Native American History in Standard Course of Study. Specifically:

- Wilmington Insurrection of 1698
- 1960 Greensboro Sit In
- 1971 Desegregation of NC Schools
- 1893 Forced Removal of Cherokee on the 'Trail of Tears' to Oklahoma

House Bill 729 - Charter School Omnibus

- May provide remote/in school instruction 185 days or 1025 hour over 9 months
- Local Boards of Education shall not require demographic information from charter schools
- Counties shall provide capital funds to charter schools

House Bill 621 - Raises dropout age to 16 starting in 2022

• Require compulsory attendance

House Bill 579- school Self-Defense Act

• Allow some school personnel to be armed

House Bill 348 – Add School Nurses

1 per school beginning 2021-2022

House Bill 152- School Report Cards

- shall include a grade for school achievement
- shall include a grade for school growth
